Establishing a Cap

- Will we have one cap or multiple caps?
- Who sets the cap?
- What sources are to be included under the cap?
- What emissions from those sources are to be counted?
- How will new/future sources and zero-emitter electricity generators be handled under cap?
- How will baselines for sources under the cap be established?
- How should emission reduction strategies such as sequestration and internal offsets (i.e. reductions in emissions at the source that are not subject to cap) be handled?

Distributing Allowances

- Auction allowances and/or distribute based on past emissions?
- If auction, then who holds it and where will the money go?
- Should the allowances be input or output based or both?
- How will allocations be distributed in terms of vintage or vintages?
- Should the program provide for allowance set asides?

Flexibility Mechanisms

- Should banking of allowances be allowed?
- Should borrowing be allowed?
- If permitted, how should inter-temporal trading be handled (i.e., trading across vintages)?

Reduction Targets

- How should reductions be achieved?
- What modeling analyses will be required to support a decision on reduction targets?

Tracking and Trading

• How should the tracking and trading system be designed and operated and by whom?

<u>Offsets</u>

• What credits should be given for out-of-sector reductions in emissions (and reductions occurring in-sector with respect to emissions not covered by the cap?)

Consistency with Global Programs

• How may the RGGI program be designed so as to maximize consistency with (and therefore potential interaction with) global trading programs.

Interrelationship Between Cap & Trade and Registry

• How will the RGGI program and the Northeast Registry project facilitated by NESCAUM interact?

Wholesale Electricity Markets

• How will a cap & trade program affect wholesale electricity markets in the region?
